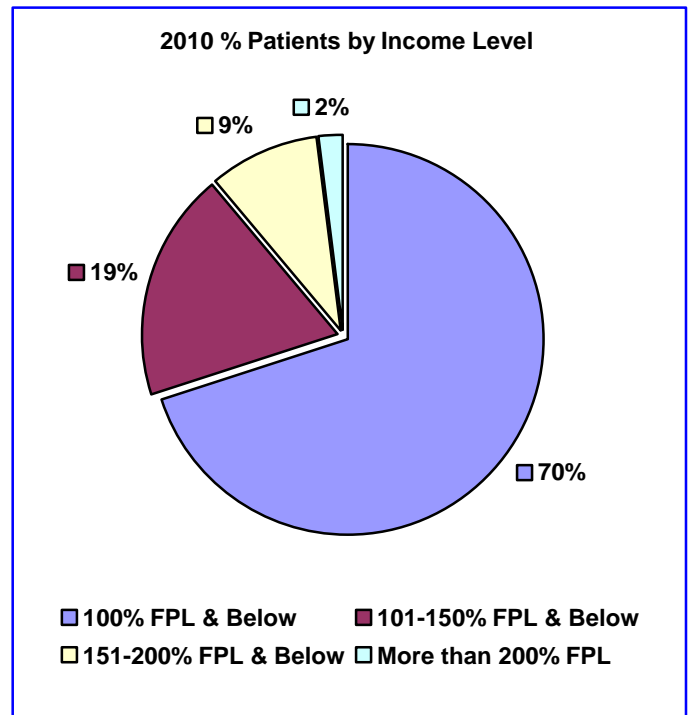
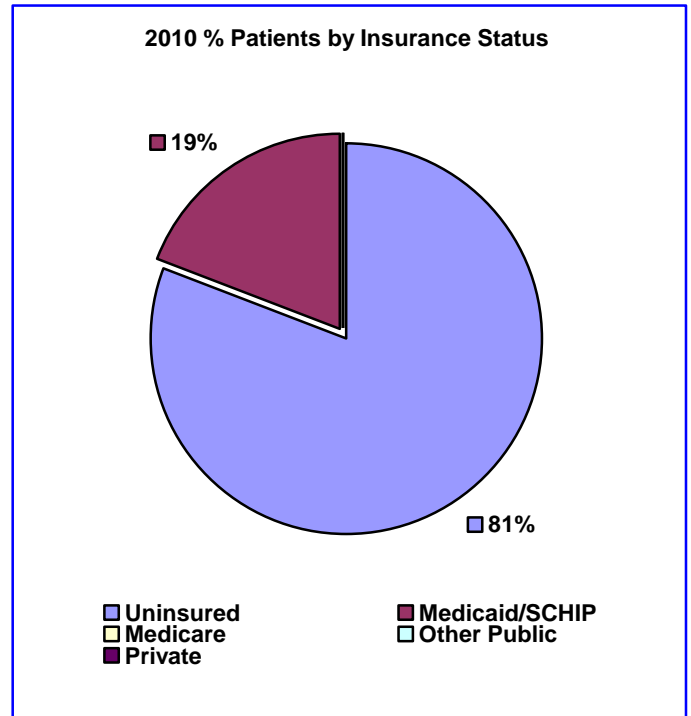
Service Area:

Marian Clinic Facts

Our Mission

We will, in the spirit of the Sisters of Charity, reveal God's healing love by improving the health of the individuals and communities we serve, especially those who are poor or vulnerable. Marian Clinic welcomes and accommodates people from every walk of life. We are a diverse and inclusive organization.

The Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth founded Marian Clinic in Topeka, Kansas in 1988 to provide medical and (later) dental care for the uninsured who live in poverty in the greater Topeka community. *No qualified patient is turned away for an inability to pay!* The Clinic's medical and dental patients are primarily adults of every faith who live in families considered to be among the "the working poor," with most having incomes at or below 100% of the federal poverty level. To be eligible, individuals must be without health insurance and meet income guidelines based on national poverty levels. Medical patients must reside in Shawnee County; there is no residency requirement for dental patients.

Marian Clinic operates two facilities in Topeka, the medical clinic at 1001 SW Garfield, in close proximity to both major hospitals, and a dental clinic at 3164 SE 6th St. in east Topeka, an income-challenged area. Combined, the Marian Clinic employs a paid staff of 42.

However, the Clinic is in many ways a community endeavor, with widespread support from faith groups, businesses, civic groups, other medical and dental providers, hospitals, and thousands of individuals. The Marian Clinic could not function without the 200+ health care professionals who *volunteer* their services as doctors, dentists, nurses, and specialists to treat our patients, both on and off-site. In addition through partnerships with two local hospitals and other medical and social service providers,

our patients also receive laboratory and diagnostic tests, surgery, mental health care, women's health care, hospitalization, social services, some medical equipment, and medications.

Medical patients receive access to health care through regular appointments, face-to-face and phone consultations. (This effort helps reduce hospital emergency room visits.) Dental patients receive emergency access the same day, with scheduled appointments assigned to treat other dental issues.

Small patient co-pays (from those who can) and reimbursement for service provide nearly 30% of the Clinic's operating budget. The Clinic relies on support from the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth and affiliates, plus gifts and grants from the public and charitable foundations for the remainder of the budget. All donations are tax deductible.

During 2010 the Clinic treated 4,913 patients during 16,920 separate visits, and supplied patients with medications valued at over \$1.8 million.

During 2011 the Clinic expects to provide 17,500 patient visits to around 5,500 patients. The annual patient census has risen every year for the last five years.
